Industry-First Certification of Methodology for Product Carbon Footprint Calculations for Lubricants, Greases and Other Specialities 17th October 2024

ATIEL and UEIL are pleased to announce an industry-first certification of the 'Methodology for Product Carbon Footprint Calculations for Lubricants, Greases and Other Specialities' by TÜV Rheinland Energy GmbH. This marks a significant milestone in the global effort to standardise carbon footprint calculations for lubricants, fluids, and greases, reinforcing the methodology's credibility and trustworthiness across the industry.

First published in September 2023 and developed in collaboration with external advisors and Carbon Minds, the ATIEL and UEIL methodology provides a harmonised approach to calculating Product Carbon Footprints (PCFs) across the lubricants, greases and specialities sectors. Now, with TÜV Rheinland's certification, companies can further validate their PCF calculations through third-party certification, driving consistency and transparency across value chains.

TÜV Rheinland Energy GmbH (hereinafter TÜV Rheinland) has carried out an independent certification of the Methodology for the Calculation of Product Carbon Footprint of Lubricants, Greases and Specialities by UEIL and ATIEL. Based on the following main standards and guidelines: ISO 14067: 2018, GHG Protocol Product Standard: 2011, the reviewer concludes that the PCF methodology approach, is scientifically based and reflects the state of the art. The approach and principles behind the methodology are generally appropriate for the assessment of potential greenhouse gas emissions impacts of lubricants, greases and other specialities. The presented approach as well as the calculation examples are coherent, transparent and comprehensible. Necessary recommendations for the documentation were discussed and implemented. For the future, TÜV Rheinland recommends to continually enhance the methodology in line with the developments in science, technology and lubricant industry and to adapt the methodology accordingly. In addition, the methodology has undergone a revision and update to reflect the evolving landscape and the changing requirements of the industry.
